## **PROGRAMME**















From 24 to 28 September 2025, Orléans will once again be ruled by its royal river: the 12th edition of the Loire Festival will see Europe's largest temporary port installed on the quays of Orléans. More than 200 vessels and some 700 mariners will gather, joined by this year's guests of honour, the sailboats of the Alpine lakes. Carried by the same winds, they'll tell the story of water's epic journey, from glacier to estuary. The city of Orléans wanted to build a bridge, spanning the traditions of lake and river, keen to raise public awareness about the water cycle and the preservation of biodiversity. Lectures, demonstrations and educational activities. organised together with the Orléans Museum for Biodiversity and the Environment (MOBE), will again focus on sustainable development and biodiversity conservation during this year's festival.

This celebration, which you have come to know so well, is far more than a picture-postcard occasion. 2025 has been declared the Year of the Sea and the International Year of Glaciers' Preservation, and here on the quayside, with the children's workshops, debates, mariners' songs and openair cafés, the fragility of our ecosystems will not be forgotten amid the festivities. Celebrating our living heritage is also about remembering that its very balance is now under threat.

At nightfall, Friday's nautical pageant and Saturday's pyro-symphonic show will set the Loire ablaze, but the real fireworks will be ignited by this communion, proving that a river is not just part of the scenery, but a promise for the future. Sailing is a commitment in itself; the festival hands us the mooring line and it's down to us to hoist the sails.



For 2025, we are heading to the great lakes of the Alps: Lake Geneva, Lake Como and Lake Maggiore are the stars of this 12<sup>th</sup> edition of the festival! Whether in France, Italy or Switzerland, they share centuries of navigation and know-how.

Discover a fleet of traditional boats straight from the Alps: batels, cochères, inglesinas and runabouts. All these boats are steeped in history and will sail the Loire during the festival. But traditional know-how will also be on show on the quayside: shipbuilding, rope work, traditional fishing, basket weaving, making pan flutes from reeds, and more.






