













Por over 600 years, Joan of Arc has been a source of fascination, inspiration and intrigue.

A historical figure who continues to be reinterpreted today and shall never be forgotten, our city's heroine has been given multiple faces through the centuries, each reflecting an era, a vision, an ideal, an inspiration.

At the height of the Hundred Years' War, in 1425 Joan of Arc first heard **voices** from the heavens urging her to lead the French army to free Orleans from the English and crown King Charles VII of France.
On 29 April, Joan of Arc entered Orléans. On 7 May, her troops took the Tourelles fort and the following day the **English** left the city. Orléans was liberated.

Since then, the Joan of Arc Festival, which became part of France's Intangible Cultural Heritage* in 2018, has been perpetuating this memory, commemorating the history that was written in Orléans, through ten days of festivities that combine civil, military and religious **traditions**, the founding triptych of Joan of Arc's identity. All in a spirit of celebration and homage.


